CHAPTER 130: GENERAL OFFENSES

§ 130.01 CURFEWS.

(A) *Curfew established.* It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 18 years to be found in or upon any public street, alley, or public common, within the corporate limits of the town, at or between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. This section does not apply to a minor who is:

- (1) Accompanied by the minor's parent or guardian;
- (2) On an errand at the direction of the minor's parent or guardian, without any detour or stop;
- (3) In a motor vehicle involved in interstate travel;
- (4) Engaged in an employment activity, or going to or returning home from an employment activity, without any detour or stop;
- (5) Involved in an emergency;
- (6) On the sidewalk abutting the minor's residence or abutting the residence of a next-door neighbor if the neighbor did not complain to the police department about the minor's presence;
- (7) Attending an official school, religious, or other recreational activity supervised by adults and sponsored by the city, a civic organization, or another similar entity that takes responsibility for the minor, or going to or returning home from, without any detour or stop, an official school, religious, or other recreational activity supervised by adults and sponsored by the city, a civic organization, or another similar entity that takes responsibility for the minor;
- (8) Exercising First Amendment rights protected by the United States Constitution, such as the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, and the right of assembly; or
- (9) Married or had been married or had disabilities of minority removed in accordance with state law.

(B) *Halloween curfew established.* Halloween curfew is hereby established at 9:00 p.m. and shall be enforced between the dates of September 30 and October 31 of each year.

(C) *Beggars Night established.* Beggars Night, a designated date and time during which the small children of the community may go from door to door “begging” for treats, shall be designated by the Town Council, at its pleasure, each year, and announced in a newspaper of general distribution. § 130.02 FIRECRACKERS AND THE LIKE.

(A) It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, or corporation to sell firecrackers, torpedoes, sky rockets, roman candles, and other explosives within the corporate limits of the town upon any other day or time than July 3 and 4 of each year.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to fire or explode any firecrackers, torpedoes, sky rockets, roman candles, or other explosives within the corporate limits of the town upon any other day or time than July 4 of each year. (Ord. 121, passed 3-25-1935) Penalty, see § 10.99

FIREARMS ON TOWN PROPERTY

§ 131.01 PROHIBITION.

No person shall carry a concealed firearm in or on any property, park, building, or portion of a building now or hereafter owned, leased as lessee, operated, occupied, managed, or controlled by the town, as well as the appurtenant premises to the buildings, upon which appropriate signage has been placed indicating that concealed firearms are prohibited therein.

§ 131.02 SIGNS REQUIRED.

Signs shall be visibly posted on the exterior of each entrance by which the general public can access the building, appurtenant premises, or park. The town shall exercise discretion in determining the necessity and appropriate location for other signs posted on the interior of the building, appurtenant premises, or park.

§ 131.03 EXEMPTIONS.

(A) The prohibitions set forth in this chapter shall not apply to persons who are exempt from concealed weapons prohibitions under state or federal law or to any duly authorized local, state, or federal law enforcement officer while on duty.

(B) The prohibitions set forth in this chapter shall not apply to highways or public highways owned or administered by the town.
